Healthy Aquatic Ecosystems Project Team Terms of Reference

Approved by the Alberta Water Council on June 17, 2008.

CONTEXT:

- This group was established to define *healthy aquatic ecosystems* and explore potential opportunities to advance the Healthy Aquatic Ecosystems (HAE) element of the *Water for Life* strategy. The identification of these opportunities is intended to provide a foundation and direction for future work under this element.
- The group is also intended to maintain the Council's focus on the HAE-related issues identified in the Council's report, *Water for Life: Recommendations for Renewal*, which noted the need to move from planning to action under this element.
- The project team will operate in a manner that is consistent with the rules, policies and procedures adopted by the Alberta Water Council, including the use of consensus to make decisions in a multi-stakeholder process.

STRATEGIC INTENT (GOAL):

• Provide a foundation and direction for future work under the Healthy Aquatic Ecosystems element of the *Water for Life* strategy.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Develop a working definition of the term healthy aquatic ecosystems
- 2. Recommend potential healthy aquatic ecosystems projects of provincial importance and identify which groups are most suited to lead them.
- 3. Identify potential HAE projects that may be undertaken within the AWC's mandate.

KEY TASKS:

- Provide regular updates to the Council.
- Prepare a work plan that includes key tasks, deliverables, and timelines.

Prepare a Definition:

- The project team will capitalize on existing Alberta Environment work towards a HAE definition and gather and review relevant information or materials that may supplement this work.
- In a one-day project team workshop, the team will develop a working definition of the term *healthy aquatic ecosystems* as it relates to the *Water for Life* strategy using the materials they gathered and reviewed prior to the meeting.
- The project team will provide context around its definition to facilitate an understanding of the recommended definition and its intent.
- The project team will present a draft definition of the term *healthy aquatic ecosystems* at the September Council board meeting.

Recommend Potential Projects:

- The project team will work with the *Water for Life* Implementation Review Committee to gather information about initiatives and needs related to the Healthy Aquatic Ecosystems element of the *Water for Life* strategy.
- The team will develop a process for prioritizing potential projects in the area of HAE.
- In a two-day workshop, the project team will:
 - Develop a list of potential HAE projects based on the information gathered by the Review Committee, existing AWC reports, and the input of the Project Team.
 - Use the prioritization process developed by the team to recommend a set of HAE projects of provincial importance.
 - Use the prioritization process developed by the team to recommend up to five potential HAE projects for the Alberta Water Council to consider undertaking.
- The project team will prepare a final report containing the following:
 - A recommended working definition of the term *healthy aquatic ecosystems* including context for understanding the recommended definition and its intent.
 - A set of recommend potential healthy aquatic ecosystems projects of provincial importance and the groups which are most suited to lead them.
 - Up to five recommended potential HAE projects the Council could undertake, along with a brief rationale and context for each recommended project.
 - A brief description of the project team's prioritization process.
 - A list of other non-priority potential HAE projects that were identified by the team.
