The report outlines criteria – developed following the Systematic Conservation Planning (SCP) methodology – a science-based, geospatial process primarily used in land use planning. The Council's report is the first time the process has been applied in relation to aquatic ecosystems. Subsequent steps in the process, to be undertaken by the province, will need to identify available data, develop "rules" for applying the criteria to the data, and produce the final map of environmentally significant aquatic areas. Alberta Environment and Water is working with Tourism, Parks and Recreation to include in the Environmentally Significant Areas map supporting watershed and regional planning.
